Though minor revisions are carried out on a regular basis, substantial revisions are usually carried out after a program's duration of minimum three years. For all of these programmes, the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is used, resulting in considerable adjustments; and the course objectives and outcomes are maintained explicitly. The outcomes of UG programmes understand the course/subject concepts, learning effective communication skills, preparing for higher studies and developing social and research skills. The outcomes of PG programme are mastery of subject knowledge, application orientated approach to relevant contexts, preparing for higher studies, exposing and enhancing research skills.

All examination processes and procedures are integrated into the indigenous software designed and developed by the in-house software team. All examination activities are carried out digitally including exam schedule venue, invigilation arrangement, question paper setting, evaluation, grading, publication of results, and issue of mark sheet. Multiple choice questions and descriptive questions were pooled in to make the examination process effectively.

Digital evaluation system was adapted as e-answer scripts were made available for external examiners to evaluate. The process is monitored by a dedicated examination committee headed by a senior faculty designated as Exam Chief Superintendent.

The Conduct of examination monitored by Internal monitoring committee and external special members visit the campus to survey

the examination process.

Continuous Internal Assessment System

Continuous Assessment Tests and other components which include written test are conducted online with the support of an embedded module in the Exam Management System and use the LMS platform like Google and Moodle.

The IT Integration in the system has improved in maintaining database and helped to speed up the process of assessment as well as evaluation ,in turn contributed towards enrichment of teaching, learning and evaluation process at various levels.
