

THE COLLEGE CREST

The College Crest is enshrined within a lotus in full bloom to represent the cult of the devotion preached by Mahaprabhu Shri Vallabhacharya. A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

SHRIMATHI DEVKUNVAR NANALAL BHATT VAISHNAV COLLEGE FOR WOMEN owes its existence to the kind munificence of Shri. Nanalal Bhatt for which the foundation stone was laid in June 1968 by his Excellency the then Governor of Tamilnadu Shri Sardar Ujjal Singh under the Presidency of the then Vice-Chancellor of the Madras University Dr. A. Lakshmanaswamy Mudaliar. The College was formally inaugurated on 19.09.1968 by his Excellency the then Governor of Tamil Nadu, Shri Sardar Ujjal Singh.

Named after the revered wife of our Founder Chairman Shri Nanalal Bhatt and owned and Managed by the Cork Industries Charities Trust, the College caters to the needs of women students in and around South Chennai.

Looking back through the years to the day when the college started functioning with an initial area of 10 acres of campus site and building thereon with an area of 10,000 sq.ft. and three hundred students in P.U.C. class, we now record with legitimate pride that we have made prodigious strides within the short span of the decade the college forged ahead into a fully blossomed first grade Women's College. On 15.2.1972, a new annexe was opened. For the second time in the history of our college, we were quite fortunate to receive the blessings of His Holiness Jagathguru Sri Jayendra Saraswathi Swamigal who inaugurated another annexe on the western side to the college main building on 15.2.1983, which indeed has added to our moral support in our endeavours to further develop the institution.

An "Administrative Block" was further added to the western wing along with the construction of the first floor comprising of the Botany and Zoology laboratories with extra class rooms on 14th February 1984. The Second floor of this wing was completed during the academic year 1988-89. The opening ceremony of the new P.G. Block was held on 8.11.1990.

The Silver Jubilee year 1992-93 witnessed a landmark in our achievements when a long felt need was fulfilled - the Auditorium. The Silver Jubilee Auditorium stage was inaugurated on the 25th College Day (20.3.1993) A new Computer block was constructed to meet the increasing demand of computers for all majors and for M.Sc. I.T.

Our Prestigious "Autonomous Block" was unveiled on 23.1.2007. Well equipped "Media Block" and well facilitated Hostel were inaugurated in the month of June, 2011.

Sophisticated and Spacious (15000Sq.ft.) indoor Stadium was inaugurated on March 6th, 2014 by his Excellency Governor of Tamil Nadu, Shri. Rosaiah.

It is also with a great feeling of pride that we highlight the fact that year after year the results of the University Examinations, besides being quite encouraging, are also outstanding.

Apart from routine academic work, wide opportunities are offered to students in varied extracurricular activities.

The College was Accredited with "A" Grade by NAAC in 2003.

Autonomous structure was introduced with effect from 2006-07 onwards. The College has been Re-accredited with A Grade by NAAC in 2011.

CONDITIONS OF ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

1. Age Limit:

Applicant for the B.A., B.Sc./B.Com. degree courses applicant should have competed 16 years and 6 months on 1st July of the admission year.

- No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fees due by her have been paid. This will be strictly adhered to.
- The College authorities reserve to themselves the right to increase the tuition and other fees at the commencement of each academic year if necessary.
- 4. Candidates are informed that the original certificates produced at the time of admission will not be returned under any circumstances in the middle of their studies in this College. They are asked to take extracts of all certificates including examination marks duly attested by a responsible person of the Gazetted rank before they submit their certificates in the College.
- Admission secured on false statements by suppression of facts will be canceled on detection at any time.
 - Admission is subject to verification of mark certificates by the Director of Government Examinations and if the mark certificate if found to be Bogus, admission is liable for cancellation besides criminal action being taken.
- 6. Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Triband other Backward communities should produce communities certificates from an officer of the Revenue Department not low in rank than a Deputy Tahsildar along with the application Community certificates should have be obtained not earlier the one year. The original should be produced at the time of admission that will not be returned on any account.
- 7. Applicants who receive the provisional admission card appear before the Principal with her parent or guardian and be ready to pay the fees on the date indicated therein and produce the following certificates when the admission is confined by Principal. Failure to pay fees on the date or to produce the soul necessary certificates will entail in the forfeiture of the soul.

- A) The list of marks obtained at the public Examination and university pass certificate are (original of provisional) necessary to secure recognition from the Madras University for candidates.
- II) Medical and vaccination certificates.
- (I) Income Certificate.
- D) Community Certificate (in case of Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe or Backward class applicant only.) in original.
- Application for extension of time for payment of fee will neither be a knowledged nor entertained. Entitlement card from the Harijan Department or permanent Community Certificate in the land of the case of scheduled Tribe only) for non-payment of fees.
- flandidate and her parent / guardian should submit a declaration the prescribed form at the time of admission.
- the admitted students should obey the rules and regulations in the college reserves the right to dismiss a student in displaced displaced.

SCHOLARSHIPS OF PRIVATE ENDOWMENTS

- 1. The Scholarship and Fee Concession holders should be aware of the facts as per the latest G.O. that they should put in not less than 75% of the term days, and that in case it is not satisfied the Scholarship will be withheld even though the students may satisfy the other criteria. This percentage may be relaxed in case of sudden sickness to be certified to the satisfaction of the sanctioning authority by competent medical authorities.
- 2. In the event of not recording 75% attendance by the students of colleges, the grant of scholarships for the next year of study shall be withdrawn.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

- 1. Regular attendance is required of the students to appear for the University Examination.
- On no account should a student abstain from attending classes. Unless prior permission is granted. The student may be granted permission by the Principal or Staff in-charge only if convinced of the bonafide reason stated. The parents are requested not to encourage their daughters in abstaining from classes. The students should submit their leave letters countersigned by the parent or guardian in the prescribed form available in the College Office before availing leave. When the absence is due in unforeseen causes an application for leave must be submitted a soon as possible and in no case later than the first-day of return to the College Application for sick-leave for more than two-days should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
 - The leave applications should be submitted through the staff in charge of attendance. When the concerned staff is on leave in students should -submit the leave applications to the department concerned.
 - 4. Abstaining from classes without leave letters will be severely
 - 5. Attendance for P.T. Classes and meetings are compulsory for students including those coming from remote places. Blue who are physically unfit should produce a medical certificate that effect.

BOOK BANK

The object of the scheme is to provide text-books to poor and deserving students. The Book-Bank is a special section attached to the main Library. Books will be issued on loan to deserving students. Current text books on all subjects are available on loan.

A student borrowing books from the Book-Bank shall be fully responsible for their safe custody. The books should not be marked, written upon or damaged. In the event of any damage or loss, she shall replace it with a new copy of the book or pay such compensation as may be decided by the Principal. The borrowers are not allowed to sub-lend the books.

All books on loan must be returned before the end of March each year. If the books are not returned in time she will not be eligible to borrow books in future. Her original certificates will be issued only on the production of a clearance certificate from the Librarian.

The Librarian may recall any book at any time even if the normal period of loan has not expired.

The Principal may exclude, at her discretion from the Privileges of the Book-Bank any borrower for the infringement of the rules.
