ADMISSION REGULATIONS

Empower your education journey with diverse opportunities at SDNBVC

- 1. The last date for the receipt of completed application is the tenth working day from the date of publication of the results of the qualifying examinations. Tamil Nadu Higher Secondary Examinations for U.G PROGRAMMES and 15 days for PG PROGRAMMES.
- 2. Incomplete applications will be rejected.
- 3. Admission for all the PROGRAMMES is based on merit.
- 4. Applicants who receive provisional admission sms /email must be ready to pay the fees on the date indicated and should produce the following certificates when admission is confirmed by the Principal. Failure to comply will result in the forfeiture of the seat.
 - a. Transfer and Conduct certificate.
 - b. H.Sc. certificates of candidates coming from schools within the Tamil Nadu University Area.
 - c. Income Certificate of parents.
 - d. Community Certificate (in case of Scheduled Caste/ Scheduled Tribe/Backward Class/Most Backward Class)
 - e. U.G. Applicants belonging to boards other than TN HSC, CBSE, ICSE should obtain an eligibility certificate from the University of Madras.

- 5. Once admitted to a course, no further change of course will be considered.
- 6. Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes, Most Backward and other backward communities should produce a true copy of permanent community certificate duly attested by Gazetted Officer. The original should be produced at the time of admission.
- 7. The original TC should be submitted at the time of admission.
- 8. Inter Disciplinary Choice Based credit system was implemented from 2008 09 onwards.
- 9. Majority of the students (But for B.Com Hons) will undergo a 30 days internship during their V semester. Students of B.Com (Hons.) will undergo 35 days internship during II, IV & V semester vacation. Students of I year P.G. will undergo a 30 days internship during summer vacation.
- 10. Students wishing to discontinue the course after admission, have to pay the entire fees payable for the complete course of study before being relieved from the college.
- 11. Fees once paid by the student will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- 12. Admitted students should comply with the rules and regulations of the college and the management has the right to dismiss a student in case of disobedience.
- 13. The college is not responsible for any accident due to careless handling of equipment /chemicals.
- 14. The college is not responsible for any loss of valuable items/cash/gold of the students.

NOTE

- 1. Candidates should ensure that correct marks are furnished in their application form. False information may result in admission cancellation, a ban on pursuing studies for three years, legal action, and admission cancellation if certificates are found to be bogus.
- 2. PG applicants from other universities must produce original pass certificates or provisional certificates or a course or study certificate. A 'Certificate of Eligibility' from the University of Madras is required before admission.
- 3. Original certificates will not be returned under any circumstance during the course. Students are advised to keep true copies duly attested by a Gazetted Officer.
- 4. Applicants are responsible for verifying their eligibility for admission.
- 5. Admission secured on false statements will be cancelled.
- **6.** Acceptance of an application does not guarantee admission.
- 7. Requests for extension of fee payment time will not be entertained.
- 8. TCs of candidates from Central Schools, Kendriya Vidyalaya, etc., should be countersigned.
- 9. Candidates from other states should produce eligibility/migration.

In light of the directives from the Honourable Supreme Court and the commitment of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to eradicate ragging, the objective is to completely eliminate all forms of ragging from universities and higher educational institutions across the nation. III. GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

VI. MADRAS UNIVERSITY STUDENTS FREE EDUCATION PROGRAMME
