Report

The Village Survey Initiative under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) was successfully organized by the Outreach Club in collaboration with the Department of Social Work (MSW) at Kothimangalam (21.12.24) & Palur Village on four different dates: 21st December 2024, 30,31st January 2025, 6th February 2025, and 10th February 2025.

Organization and Execution

1. Planning & Coordination:

 The Outreach Club and the Department of Social Work meticulously planned the survey, outlining key focus areas such as education, healthcare, livelihood, and community development. Faculty coordinators and student volunteers were assigned specific roles to ensure smooth execution.

2. Pre-Survey Training:

 Before each visit, volunteers underwent orientation sessions covering survey methodologies, data collection techniques, and ethical considerations while interacting with the community.

3. On-Ground Implementation:

- o Teams were divided to cover different **streets and households** within the village.
- Structured interviews and observation techniques were employed to gather data.
- o Special focus was given to **women, children, and elderly villagers** to understand their unique challenges.

4. Community Engagement & Challenges:

- Volunteers actively engaged with the villagers, discussing their daily struggles, awareness of government schemes, and possible solutions.
- o Challenges such as **language barriers**, **hesitation in sharing information**, **and time constraints** were managed through interactive sessions and rapport-building.

5. Data Compilation & Follow-Up:

- o The collected data was systematically recorded for analysis.
- Findings were discussed with faculty members to develop action plans and recommendations for future outreach programs.
